TRAILS

At this time we have no plan to close the trails. However, we ask that you take all trash with you. If we see that is not working we may have to close the trails before we want to. SPRUCE CREEK PARK

As soon as a case is discovered, we may decide to close the park. At this time, bring hand wash like Purell and share with other families. Wipe and wash hands before and after playing. If we see this is not working we may have no choice but to close the park for the safety of everyone.
