After Covid-19: Earth Day Nelson Has Gone Digital



As RVF adapts to the unexpected changes caused by Covid-19, we have gone digital to celebrate Earth Day's 50th international anniversary.

The Earth Day Nelson Festival originally scheduled for April 19 has been tentatively postponed to Sunday, August 23, 2020, and will be combined with RVF's 15th anniversarv celebration that weekend as well as the 10th anniversary of our Rockfish Loop Trail.

In order to celebrate **Earth Day Nelson 2020** digitally, *all* students in the Nelson County area (NCPS,

homeschoolers, North Branch, Afton Christian School, etc.) as well as anyone in the surrounding counties (Albemarle, Augusta, Amherst, Rockbridge, etc.) and cities thereof are invited to participate in our digital <u>Earth-Art-Athon</u>, which will replace our poster contest that we previously had scheduled to take place at our festival. Submissions will be accepted *until* Wednesday, June 10, 2020. Ten random participants will be chosen to win an Earth Day T-shirt among other prizes! Winners' names to be drawn & announced on June 12th.

Additionally, RVF will be hosting a daily **Earth Day Challenge** on our <u>Facebook page</u> from now until April 25. Each day, there will be a post about actions individuals and families can do to celebrate and take care of the planet during a pandemic. Instructions and Guidelines for Earth-Art-Athon:

Q: How do I submit?

A: There are several options for submitting your eco-art:

- 1) If you are under 13 or over 13 & don't have Facebook, have your parent post for you directly on our Facebook along with the hashtag #earthdaynelson2020,
- 2) If you or your parents don't have Facebook, email us your submission to programdirector@rockfishvalley.org,
- 3) If you don't have internet access, give your art (or a copy of it) to your teacher or other school staff during designated pickup/drop off dates & times, & ask them to send us a picture of your submission.
- *Please let us know if you want to be anonymous. Likewise, feel free to submit a picture of yourself if you would like to have that posted alongside your submission.

Q: Will there be any prizes?

A: We will do a raffle and pull 10 names from a hat. Those 10 names will win a special Earth Day t-shirt to take home. Other prizes will also be included - but these will be a surprise! The more entries you submit, the

Q: What kind of art can I submit?

A: Any form of artwork will be accepted! This includes *visual* (graphic design on computers, photography, collages, paintings, drawings, in any medium, i.e. charcoal, crayons, pencils, markers, multimedia, items found in nature); *3D* (woodworking, sculpture, crafts, fabric, clay, beading,upcycled art using bottle caps, bottles, etc.), *performance** (songs, dances, short skits, comedy, miming, instrumental compositions on piano, guitar, clarinet, etc.), *language* (poems, prose, short stories, plays), etc. Anything goes as long as it can be considered art and is about celebrating the earth and/or protecting our planet. *Please keep performance entries under 2 minutes.

Q: How will you know which one is mine?

A: Regardless of how you submit, include your name, grade, school, teacher, and the title of your artwork with your submission.

Q: How will you be displaying entries?

A: We will have these on our Facebook page under the event called "Earth Day Nelson Eco-Art Show for Kids" which will be active by Friday, March 27. Entries will also be posted on our website at www.rockfishvalley.org in a rotating slideshow. Don't forget to add the
